Birds of Congaree National Park

Congaree National Park protects over 15,000 acres of floodplain forest swamp and adjacent uplands along the Congaree River near Columbia, SC. This bird checklist summarizes the status of 178 species which have occurred in the park. Since most of the park is forest, many species that are common in farmlands just outside of the park are listed here as rare or are absent altogether. Certain species (such as owls and goatsuckers) are more common than this list indicates.

Explanation of Symbols:
 * = probably breeds in the park
 a = abundant (95% chance)
 c = common (80% chance)
 u = uncommon (50% chance)
 o = occasional (20% chance)
 r = rare (5% chance or less)
 - = may occur, but no record for this month.
