

How to Make a Moveable Marsh

1. Color the plants and animals on all of the marsh scenes.
2. Cut out the two inserts and the frame along the solid black lines.
3. Cut out the windows in the frame along the dotted lines.
4. Fold the frame in half along the dotted "fold" line.
5. Hold the frame so the folded edge is on the left. Staple or tape together the top and bottom edges of the frame.
6. Slide one of the inserts into the frame, placing the word "pull" on the right-hand side. Slowly pull out the insert until all the animals are visible.

Wildlife from left to right: northern leopard frog, while-tailed deer, yellow-headed blackbird, ruddy duck, northern eyed brown dragonfly, muskrat, red-winged blackbird, mink, bulrush, American bittern and cattail.

The Riverway is bordered by many freshwater marshes. These wetlands provide habitat which is essential to the survival of wildlife that make the riverway their home.
