This list represents the number of each species of birds caught and banded during migration between May 7, 1989 and May 29, 1989 at the St. Croix Watershed Research Station, Marine-on-St. Croix, Minnesota. Twenty seven species totaling 112 birds were captured during this period. This was part of a project that attempted to determine whether birds can be a vector for Lyme Disease through attached ticks. The Watershed Research Station is located on the St. Croix River 1 mile south of Marine-on-St. Croix.
