




American Camp



Welcome to American Camp, the southern unit of San Juan Island National Historical Park. The site includes nearly 1,250 acres of saltwater shoreline, prairie, forest and historic structures. Visitor center exhibits focus on archaeology and daily life in both camps. Except for federal holidays, the center is open Thursday through Sunday fall, winter and spring, and daily during summer. Rangers and volunteers are on duty to provide information.

The Prairie Walks



Self-guided Historical Walk — Relive the Pig War along the trail that starts in the Visitor Center parking lot. Pick up guides in boxes at trailhead. (1.25 mi. loop)

Grandma's Cove — Stroll downhill to one of the finest beaches on San Juan Island. Use caution in descending the bluff to the beach. (.25 mi. from Visitor Center.)

Bluff Walks — Primitive tracks criss-cross the prairie and trace the bluff from Grandma's Cove to South Beach and back to the Visitor Center via the Redoubt. Walkers are advised to use caution as rabbits have excavated warrens throughout the prairie. Stepping in a hole can cause injuries. (2.5 mi.)
