Walter Andersen: No, see, my Mom wrote and told me that one of the neighbor's boys was up there in Attu in the Army and she gave me his outfit's name I went to look for him. He was in the battle of Attu. We used to call the army guys "dog faces." I found Joe up there and he looked like a dog face. [both laughing] He lived, these guys lived in a cave. They were with the mountain group. I remember I went up there and the Army guys had a lot of souvenirs, you know, like swords and things like that.

Janis Kozlowski: Oh, from the Japanese?

Walter Andersen: Yes, so I talked to Joe and he said he had some things. So I went down and talked to one of our officers, he said he'd swap him for whiskey. So they went up there [laughing] and he gave the neighbor kid the whiskey and he gave him some ... whatever they had – parts of uniforms or something.
