## **Speakers**

#### **Bryce Stevenson**

Friday, 4 pm - Workshop Tent From the Red Cliff Reservation, and owner/chef of Miijim on Madeline Island, Bryce produces Indigenous inspired dishes. Describing Miijim, he says it is "Ojibwe medicine with French soul." Traditional flavors of roasted and grilled game meats like venison, elk, and rabbit paired with foraged ingredients such as local mushrooms, ramps, chaga, and bergamot, Miijim features an ever-evolving menu featuring the seasonality of the Chequamegon Bay and its farmers, foragers, hunters, and gatherers.

#### Heid E. Erdrich

Saturday, 3 pm - Workshop Tent Author of *Original Local: Indigenous Foods, Stories, and Recipes from the Upper Midwest.* Ms. Erdrich is a writer from North Dakota who curates art exhibits, teaches, researches and collaborates with other artists. She is Ojibwe, enrolled at Turtle Mountain.

#### Jeff Pavlik

Known as "the Baker of Michilimackinac." Throughout the weekend, professional baker and re-enactor Jeff Pavlik will be baking near the bread oven and sharing his knowledge about bread and the French-Canadian voyageurs.
