



19. Pictures:		
Take pictures with a camera or your phone. Pictures taken at the time of the uncovering event are often the only documentation that takes place because of the short time interval between the uncovering and recovering of the wreck fragment. Take numerous pictures from various angles and try to capture all sides of the wreckage. If unique features are present (dowels, worm holes, etc.), take close-ups. The more pictures the better. If landmarks are close by, try to get them in the photos. Remember to take pictures that have something to provide scale (measuring tape, people, cars, rulers, pens, hats, sunglasses, etc.). It is important to have other objects in the pictures as scale so we get a sense of the size of the wreckage. Note: Make sure to not have shadows in the pictures.
