Specifications for Pillow Sacks.

Material.—To be made of cotton or linen drilling, or seven (7) ounce cotton duck of good quality.

Dimensions.—Length, when filled, twenty-seven and one-half ($27\frac{1}{2}$) inches; width, when filled, seventeen (17) inches; depth, when filled, three and three-fourths ($3\frac{3}{4}$) to four (4) inches. Measurements to be made from corner to corner.

To have an opening or fly in the seam in the upper side seven (7) inches long, to be fastened with two (2) strings of three-quarter ($\frac{3}{4}$) inch cotton tape. Ends of opening to be properly stayed with button-hole stitch.

Ends of sack to be cut square.
